Dear Mr. Bonnett:

Quality Carriers, Inc. was suspended from the Customs-Trade Partnership Against Terrorism (C-TPAT) program due to an incident. Quality Carriers, Inc. was also denied the use of program benefits, including access to the Free And Secure Trade (FAST) lanes. As a result of the post incident analysis conducted by U.S. Customs and Border Protection, with input provided by Quality Carriers, Inc., and the security improvements made by Quality Carriers, Inc., it has been determined that Quality Carriers, Inc. has now employed appropriate security measures and practices to reduce the likelihood of a breach in the international supply chain.

Quality Carriers, Inc. is hereby REINSTATED into the C-TPAT program, with full benefits including access to the FAST lanes.

CBP appreciates the investigation of this incident by Quality Carriers, Inc. and the security enhancements which your company continues to make to further secure your shipments.
